



WHEN YOU ENTER THE BOCCE BALL COMPLEX YOU ACKNOWLEDGE THAT YOU ARE USING THE BOCCE BALL FACILITIES AT YOUR OWN RISK. COVID-19 MAY BE PRESENT.

In accordance with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), State of Arizona, and HOA Board of Directors, bocce ball players are required to follow these guidelines.

1. **Do not play if you are sick or have been exposed to Covid-19. In both cases, you should self-quarantine for a minimum of 14 days.**
2. Initially, only residents will be allowed to play at SVE courts. There will be no visitors allowed, without exception.
3. Bring your own water bottle/towels/tissues/personal hand sanitizer
4. Wash/sanitize hands before, during and after play
5. Maintain six-foot social distancing guidelines at all times. This includes entering and exiting courts, changing ends of the court, water/rest breaks.
6. Maximum four players at any one court at a time. Two players on each end (each player throws four balls).
7. The restrooms will be open for use but only for one person at a time. Do not congregate at the restroom doors. Social distancing of at least six feet is required.
8. Each player is reminded that the choice of whether to participate is up to each individual and the risks of such action are completely the responsibility of that player i.e., you play at your own risk.

The success of reopening efforts is dependent on the cooperation of you, our residents. If the HOA Board finds that residents are not following guidelines and potentially endangering themselves and others, additional closures and/or restrictions would be likely.

SVE BOCCE BALL GUIDELINES – PHASE ONE

The following guidelines have been developed by the Bocce Ball Board officers and the HOA Board of Directors as a result of guidelines for Phase One reopening following the Covid-19 shutdown. Players are required to follow these guidelines. They will be strictly enforced, primarily by the Bocce Ball Board members, but it is expected that all Bocce Ball players will adhere to the rules. We want to keep the courts open for all those who want to play and it will take everyone's cooperation to make that happen.

REQUIREMENTS OF BOCCE BALL BOARD MEMBERS:

1. Disseminate information contained in these and other guidelines to all Bocce Ball members through email bulletins/club website/SVE Facebook page
2. Monitor Bocce Ball players and encourage compliance with all guidelines listed below.

REQUIREMENTS OF SVE HOA BOARD AND ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE:

1. Prepare and install signs for outdoor courts listing requirements to play Bocce Ball
2. Initially provide hand sanitizer. Further provision will be the responsibility of the club and/or individuals.
3. Taping off or covering water fountains so only bottle fillers are usable.
4. Courts will be open from 6:30 PM to 8:30 PM Monday thru Thursday.
5. The maintenance staff will thoroughly clean the restrooms twice a day.

REQUIREMENTS OF BOCCE BALL PLAYERS:

1. **Do not play if you are sick or have been exposed to Covid-19. In both cases, you should self-quarantine for a minimum of 14 days.**
